


## CHAPTER 1 Meet Willy Wizard

Willy the Wacky Wizard was not always wacky.


In fact, he used to live a quiet life in study.



One day, Willy Wizard began to read a book on alchemy.


Alchemy is the study of magical chemical processes.

From hillside campfires he would collect salamanders.


On one dark and gloomy night, he had to venture into a deep, dark cave to gather the scales off a sleeping dragon.

Glass tubes filled with colored liquids littered a table in the center of the room.




A stack of musty, old books written by a Magus Crakmonius sat upon a stool.

And bins full of bones from both man and beast were tucked into another corner.


Willy Wizard was now ready to begin!




One day, while Willy Wizard was playing hopscotch down in his laboratory using the chunk of lead, he heard a knock on his front door.


Willy Wizard, surprised that someone would be at his home, ran up the basement stairs and answered the door.

Willy Wizard saw Bertha Vitch to the door and as she stepped over the threshold and into the stormy night, she turned around and handed Willy Wizard a package.




"It's to help with your studies," she said and then she disappeared.
